



Prinergy Acrobat Plug-Ins for Acrobat 7

What's new about the Acrobat 7 version of the Plug-ins?


- In Acrobat 7, the menu location to access the Creo plug-ins is now Advanced→CreoTools instead of Tools→CreoTools. The toolbar of icons can still be found under View→Toolbars→CreoTools.
- Plug-in names have changed
 - The new plug-ins will only work in Acrobat version 7 whereas older versions were backwards compatible. So to distinguish them, the new plug-ins will have a "7" in their filenames. For example, "CreoToolsPro7.api" is the name of the Trapper/Dotshop/Separation viewer plug-in and will only work in Acrobat 7. "CreoToolsPro.api" will work in Acrobat 6 and lower.
 - The Mac OSX versions will have filenames that have the extension ".acroplugin" while Windows versions will have the extension ".api". Previously, Mac plug-ins had no extension.
- The appearance of tables in the Mac OSX versions of the PDF Trapper and Dotshop has changed. These changes were unavoidable due to the plug-in architecture changes in Acrobat 7. To rebuild the tables to look the same would have resulted in longer delays in shipping the plug-ins.




PDF Trapper Properties editor in Acrobat 7

Where do the plug-ins get installed? (Mac OSX)

- In <volume>/Applications/Adobe Acrobat 7.0 Professional/, choose Acrobat 7.0 Professional and press <cmd> plus I, or from the File menu, select Get Info.
- The Acrobat 7.0 Professional Info dialog box appears.
- Click Plug-ins.
- A list of installed plug-ins appears.
- Click Add.
- Unstuff the plugins from the file "Acro7Plugins_Mac.hqx". Browse to the location where you unstuffed the plugins and choose all plug-ins.
- Click Choose.
- Close the Acrobat 7.0 Professional Info dialog box.
- Reopen the Acrobat 7.0 Professional Info dialog box
- Click Plug-ins to verify that the Prinergy plug-ins were installed and are listed.

Where do the plug-ins get installed? (Windows)

- Unzip the plugins from the file "Acro7Plugins_PC.zip".
- Copy the plugins to <drive>\Program Files\Adobe\Acrobat 7.0\Acrobat\Plug_ins\Prinergy.
Where: <drive> is the disk drive that Adobe Acrobat is installed on (typically c:\).
